## East Midlands

IGas Energy plc <u>published</u> their full year accounts for the year ended 31 December 2020.

Drill or Drop? <u>report</u> that equipment has arrived at Rathlin Energy's West Newton-B site for cased hole logging of the WNB1z well. Union Jack Oil PLC <u>released</u> an update on West Newton operations and the well testing programme.

Lincoln Climate Commission <u>published</u> an open letter to Lincolnshire County Council urging them to refuse planning permission for Egdon Resources planned Biscathorpe well. Egdon Resources <u>published</u> their interim results for the six months ended 31 January 2021.

## South East

UK Oil & Gas plc (UKOG), <u>published</u> their full year accounts for the year ended 30 September 2020. UKOG <u>announced</u> that they are one of the six founder members of the Geothermal Energy Advancement Association (<u>GEAA</u>).

Angus Energy plc announced the issue of 15,000,000 Ordinary Shares.

Drill or Drop? <u>report</u> that Horse Hill Developments Limited have written to Surrey County Council that they are scaling back their crude oil storage capacity to less than 50 tonnes.

## Other news

Bloomberg Green <u>report</u> that natural gas is falling out of favour with emissions wary investors and utilities.

The UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson <u>announced</u> that the UK would commit to cutting carbon emissions by 78% by 2035 compared to 1990 levels.
