East Midlands

IGas Energy PLC published their full year results for the year ended 31 December 2021.

Europa Oil & Gas (Holdings) PLC published interim results for the six months ending 31 January 2022.

Egdon Resources PLC <u>announced</u> that they had submitted an appeal against the refusal of planning permission by Lincolnshire County Council for a side-track at Biscathorpe. Egdon Resources <u>published</u> their interim results for the six months ended 31 January 2022.

South East

Angus Energy PLC <u>announced</u> that Sound Energy PLC had decided not to proceed with a possible offer for the company. Angus Energy <u>announced</u> that they had raised £675,000 through the placing of 61,363,634 ordinary shares to support the company until revenues from Saltfleetby come on stream. Surrey Council planners <u>published</u> a report supporting more oil production at Brockham. Drill or Drop? <u>report</u> that Surrey County Councillors approved plans for oil production at Brockham.
