

## Overview of conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas – August 2019

This is a summary overview of developments in the conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas industry, it includes planning, operations and business activities as well as objections and protests.

This review is based on a variety of sources and no guarantee can be given as to the accuracy of this information, links to references and further information are included.

## East Midlands

Two campaigners who were arrested while <u>protesting</u> outside Egdon Resources' Biscathorpe site in Lincolnshire were found not guilty.

A <u>protestor</u> at Rathlin Energy's West Newton site was remanded in custody at Hull Magistrates Court, the trial is to be in September. The Environmental Agency (EA) has <u>approved</u> variations to the West Newton site's environmental permit, including acid wash and squeeze, cold venting of gas and handling of crude oil on site. The AIM-listed investment company Reabold Resources <u>announced</u> that it has increased its investment in Rathlin Energy (UK) Ltd. <u>Well testing</u> started at the West Newton well site, local residents complained of smells. Well test operations at West Newton were suspended pending analysis of the data acquired, <u>initial evaluation</u> identified a gross oil column of approximately 45m underlying a gross gas column of approximately 20m.

Third Energy <u>told</u> the Kirby Misperton community liaison group that they intend to concentrate on their conventional gas sites

## South East

UK Oil & Gas plc (UKOG) <u>announced</u> that the Phase 2 Kimmeridge test at Horse Hill has produced a further 5,524 barrels (bbl) of dry Brent quality oil. UKOG <u>announced</u> that they have signed a deal to acquire the entire share capital of Magellan Petroleum, who currently have 35% of the Horse Hill licences PEDL137 and PEDL246.

UKOG have applied for permission to build a road junction on common land at Dunsfold, Surrey.

UKOG <u>announced</u> that the Oil & Gas Authority, had extended the exploration terms for two licences in Surrey and the Isle of Wight

## Other news

The UK government's chief environmental scientist, Professor Sir Ian Boyd <u>warns</u> that people must use less transport, eat less red meat and buy fewer clothes if the UK is to virtually halt greenhouse emissions by 2050.

A 2.9ML earth tremor was <u>recorded</u> in Lancashire, and is thought to be associated with hydraulic fracturing operations at Cuadrilla's Preston New Road site.
