East Midlands

Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on the decision by North Yorkshire Council that Europa Oil & Gas Ltd and its partner Egdon Resources UK plc proposed well at Burniston, near Scarborough will require an environmental impact assessment.

Drill or Drop? reported on Lincolnshire County Councils draft minerals plan.

South East

UK Oil & Gas plc (UKOG) <u>reported</u> that RWE has written a letter of support for its Dorset and Yorkshire underground hydrogen storage projects. UKOG <u>announced</u> that it had conditionally raised £1.0 million by a placing of Ordinary shares to fund hydrogen storage. UKOG <u>announced</u> that it had executed a heads of terms for the 60 year lease of land and subsurface mineral rights for a second underground salt-cavern hydrogen storage facility in south Dorset.
