

Overview of conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas – December 2018

This is a summary overview of developments in the conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas, it includes planning, operations and business activities as well as objections and protests.

This review is based on a variety of sources and no guarantee can be given as to the accuracy of this information, links to references and further information are included.

East Midlands

The OGA <u>approves</u> the farm-in agreement between Union Jack Oil and Rathlin Energy for West Newton which gives Union Jack Oil 16.665% interest. Reabold Resources completed its <u>acquisition</u> of 37% of Rathlin Energy UK for £3m. <u>Protestors</u> took part in a slow walk to delay deliveries to the West Newton-A site.

Lincolnshire County council approved retrospective planning permission for security cabins at Egdon Resources' <u>Biscathorpe</u> site, drilling operations are expected to start in early January and the well is expected to be completed in February 2019. Local residents continue to <u>demonstrate</u> at the well site, see also <u>Lincolnshire Live</u>.

The Environmental Agency issue revised environmental permit to IGas for the <u>Rempstone</u> and <u>South</u> <u>Leverton</u> Oilfields.

South East

Doriemus raise \$308,759 to fund tests at Horse Hill and Brockham.

Angus Energy <u>announce</u> the beginning of flow testing at Brockham in Surrey, Angus have permission to <u>appraise</u> the well at present.

UK Oil & Gas <u>announce</u> that they are discussing acquiring Solo Oil's 30% shareholding in Arreton in the Isle of Wight, this would give UKOG a 95% share of PEDL331.

Environmental Agency issue oil and gas mining waste permits to IGas for Bletchingley in Surrey.

UKOG <u>apply</u> to Surrey County Council to drill a further four production wells and a water re-injection well at Horse Hill

Protestors win right to appeal against UKOG's anti-protest injunction in Surrey and Sussex.

Other news

Over 200 MPs call for their pension fund to phase out investments in fossil fuels.

Fracking operations paused at Preston New Road near <u>Blackpool</u> following a 1.5 magnitude tremor.
