

Overview of conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas – July 2021

This is a summary overview of developments in the conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas industry. It includes planning, operations and business activities as well as objections and protests.

East Midlands

Rathlin Energy (UK) Ltd <u>published</u> their financial statement for the year ended 31 December 2021. Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on Rathlin Energy's planning application for oil production at West Newton A. Union Jack Oil plc <u>published</u> an update on the testing of the West Newton B-1Z well.

Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> that the Conservative MP, Victoria Atkins, who represents Biscathorpe in Lincolnshire objects to Egdon Resources proposals for long tern oil production. Union Jack Oil plc <u>published</u> details from a Carbon Intensity Study on the Biscathorpe project.

Angus Energy <u>announced</u> that Lincolnshire County Council Planning committee have decided in favour of their application to drill a side-track at Saltfleetby.

Egdon Resources plc published an operational update on their Wressle well.

South East

UK Oil & Gas PLC (UKOG) <u>announced</u> that they had raised approximately £5m in a share placing. UKOG <u>announced</u> that they had raised £462,554 through an open offer to shareholders. Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on the planning enquiry into UKOG's exploration plans at Loxley/Dunsfold in Surrey, (they reported on each day of the hearing, see article for further links).

Other news

Energy Voice <u>reported</u> that UK government oil revenues have fallen by over 70% due to price reductions and decommissioning costs.
