

## Overview of conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas – May 2019

This is a summary overview of developments in the conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas, it includes planning, operations and business activities as well as objections and protests.

This review is based on a variety of sources and no guarantee can be given as to the accuracy of this information, links to references and further information are included.

## East Midlands

Egdon Resources has <u>applied</u> to Lincolnshire County Council to vary the conditions for their application to drill at North Kelsey.

Protestors continue to <u>demonstrate</u> at Rathlin Energy's West Newton site.

<u>Proposals</u> by Angus Energy to use funds intended for abandonment to reconnect a gas field in the north of England have been <u>criticised</u>.

## South East

The Environmental Agency <u>announced</u> that they have accepted the surrender of the permit for Holmwood wellsite from Europa Oil & Gas.

Frack Free Isle of Wight sends an <u>open letter</u> to landowners in the Isle of Wight about potential implications of leasing sites to oil and gas companies. UK Oil & Gas (UKOG) later <u>replied</u> to the open letter.

Angus Energy <u>reported</u> that they have successfully re-perforated their BRX4Z sidetrack at Brockham and after recompleting the well they <u>demobilised</u> the rig.

Angus Energy <u>announced</u> an Open Offer to existing shareholders with the intention of raising £457,000. This <u>raised</u> £31,240 which will be used for working capital.

The British Geological Survey (BGS) <u>recorded</u> a <u>2.5 magnitude</u> earthquake between Newdigate and Charlwood in Surrey, this was followed a few days later by a <u>0.6 magnitude</u> tremor.

Drilling application meeting for Horse Hill was <u>cancelled</u> by Surrey County Council for the second time and the decision has been <u>delayed</u> to at least July. Later protestors <u>halted</u> a Surrey County Council meeting.

Union Jack Oil <u>announced</u> a loss of £1.1m in its accounts for 2018, this is mainly due to the refusal of the environment secretary to renew the lease on the Holmwood exploration site.

UKOG <u>announced</u> that the Horse Hill field has produced over 20,500 barrels of oil and is continuing to produce at a stable rate of over 220 bopd.

Brockham Oil Watch organised a public meeting on earthquakes and unconventional drilling in the Weald Basin, this included a talk by David K. Smythe, Emeritus Professor of Geophysics, University of Glasgow, see video of talk.
