## East Midlands

Angus Energy plc <u>announced</u> the commissioning of their recently drilled B7T sidetrack well at Saltfleetby. Angus Energy <u>published</u> an update on the production ramp up at Saltfleetby. Angus Energy <u>published</u> an update of Saltfleetby production and future drilling plans.

Union Jack Oil plc published their 2002 annual report and financial statements.

Egdon Resources plc <u>announced</u> that it had agreed to a takeover by Petrichor Partners LP. Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on a report to the planning inspector for the North Kelsey well. Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> that Egdon Resources had applied to keep their Waddock Cross site in Dorset open until June 2033.

IGas Energy plc <u>announced</u> that its geothermal business GT Energy has been selected as preferred bidder to deliver a geothermal heat solution for the Wythenshawe Hospital in Manchester.

## South East

Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on the downgrading of the UK Oil & Gas plc (UKOG) Horse Hill-1 well in Surrey. UKOG <u>published</u> the results of their Annual General Meeting. Waverly Borough Council's Executive <u>confirmed</u> that it will challenge the decision of the Secretary of State for Levelling UP, Housing and Communities to allow oil and gas exploration at Loxley, near Dunsfold.

Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> that the residents of Balcombe have been given permission to bring a legal challenge against plans to test the Angus Energy oil well.

## Other news

Drill or Drop? <u>reviewed</u> the February 2023 UK onshore production data.

Energy Voice <u>reported</u> that TotalEnergies had launched a legal action against Greenpeace following a report from November 2022 on the company's carbon footprint.
