

## Overview of conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas - November 2018

This is a summary overview of developments in the conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas, it includes planning, operations and business activities as well as objections and protests.

This review is based on a variety of sources and no guarantee can be given as to the accuracy of this information, links to references and further information are included.

## East Midlands

Small <u>protest</u> against oil drilling took place at the Biscathorpe site in Lincolnshire, the site is currently under construction. Natalie Bennett of the Green Party published an <u>article</u> on local objections in the Ecologist.

<u>Planners</u> recommend that planning consent at Rathlin Energy's West Newton A site in East Yorkshire should be extended until 2021. <u>Reabold Resources</u> will invest £3 million in Rathlin Energy in exchange for a 37.08% equity interest. East Riding of Yorkshire Council <u>approve</u> by six votes to five, the extension of planning permission for Rathlin Energy's West Newton A site. Rathlin Energy <u>announce</u> that construction operations would begin at West Newton A on or after 3 December 2019.

Planning officers <u>recommend</u> North Lincolnshire council approve planning consent for Wressle oil field. However, the council <u>rejected</u> Egdon Resources' proposal for long term oil production for the third time. <u>Egdon Resources</u> are to appeal the decision.

## South East

The HSE issued two improvement notices (<u>here</u> and <u>here</u>) to IGas following an unintentional escape of water at their Stockbridge oil field in Hampshire in July 2018. The company has until 15 January 2019 to comply with the notices.

Campaigners <u>call</u> for tougher rules to cover the use of acid at Weald oil field sites.

UKOG published <u>results</u> from the Horse Hill well tests, both gas and oil were produced during the tests.

Angus Energy submitted an updated <u>statement</u> on the proposed workover to the Brockham oil well to Surrey County Council. The Environmental Agency issued a <u>permit</u> requiring more controls before appraisal and production can begin at the site.

Report from the <u>OGA</u> on a workshop discussing the seismic activity seen around Newdigate in 2018 concluded that there was no causal link between the seismic events and oil and gas activity.

A local residents' group reports that UKOG is pulling out of its site at Markwells Wood.

## Other news

<u>Angus Energy</u> announce a placing of 22.2 million shares, subject to approval of shareholders on 22 November 2018.
