East Midlands

Union Jack Oil plc <u>published</u> unaudited accounts for the six months ended 30 June 2024. Union Jack Oil <u>published</u> a Wressle Planning Update, they have been informed that North Lincolnshire Council will not resist a legal challenge to their granting planning permission for further development at Wressle. This follows the Finch Supreme Court decision. Europa Oil & Gas (Holdings) plc also <u>published</u> a Wressle Planning Update.

Drill or Drop? reported that Angus Energy plc has withdrawn proposals to drill four new wells at Saltfleetby.

South East

Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> that production at Horse Hill, UK Oil & Gas plc's (UKOG)had continued in July following the decision by the Supreme Court had removed their planning permission for production. Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on protests by Extinction Rebellion at Horse Hill. Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> that Surrey County Council was reviewing the situation at Horse Hill. Friends of the Earth issued a <u>complaint</u> to Surrey County Council regarding Horse Hill.

Other news

Drill or Drop? reviewed the July 2024 UK onshore production data.

Emma Pinchbeck <u>announced</u> as the new Chief Executive of the Climate Change Committee (CCC). The CCC has <u>advised</u> the UK Government that territorial greenhouse gas emissions should be reduced by 81% from 1990 to 2035.

Watts Up With That? <u>reported</u> on an article in the <u>Daily Telegraph</u> (paywall) about a potential challenge to plans for building electricity pylons in the UK.
