

Overview of conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas - September 2021

This is a summary overview of developments in the conventional onshore UK Oil and Gas industry. It includes planning, operations and business activities as well as objections and protests.

East Midlands

Fossil Free East Yorkshire <u>published</u> a report by KVA Planning Consultancy criticising Rathlin Energy's planning application to increase the size of the West Newton A site. East Riding of Yorkshire Council planners <u>published</u> a report recommending approval of the development at West Newton-A. The East Riding of Yorkshire's planning committee <u>voted</u> to reject Rathlin Energy's application.

Union Jack Oil plc published their half year report for the year up to 30 June 2021.

Egdon Resources plc issued an operation update, which included the initial production from Wressle.

South East

IGas Energy plc <u>announced</u> that they had submitted planning applications for both the Albury and Bletchingley hydrogen projects to Surrey County Council. IGas <u>announced</u> that they had signed an agreement with CeraPhi Energy for repurposing onshore assets for geothermal energy. IGas <u>published</u> their interim results for the six months to 30 June 2021.

Horse Hill Developments Ltd published their annual report for the year ended 30 September 2020.

UK Oil & Gas plc <u>announced</u> that they had completed a planned two week production facility upgrade at the Horse Hill oil field.

Angus Energy plc released an update on the reprocessing and reinterpretation of the Lidsey seismic data.

Other news

The UK had to use a <u>coal fired power station</u> to maintain supplies after global gas and power prices hit a new high and wind farms produced low levels of electricity. This led to <u>reports</u> of already high European energy prices climbing. The Independent <u>reports</u> that following a fire, the <u>interconnect</u> between France and the UK was shut down, leading to a surge in wholesale electricity prices.

Drill or Drop? report on the latest UK onshore oil production data from May 2021.

Nature <u>published</u> an article claiming that global oil and gas production must decline at a rate of 3% per year to achieve the Paris Agreement goals for temperature rise.

Carbon Tracker published their fifth annual analysis of the risk of investing in oil and gas producers.

The UK Government <u>launched</u> a consultation on changes to the documentation that guides decisions on energy developments.

Sky News <u>reported</u> that fossil fuel companies are bringing cases against governments for damages due to climate policies.
