East Midlands

Union Jack Oil PLC <u>published</u> their results for the half year ending 30 June 2022. Union Jack <u>announced</u> that they were providing a £1,000,000 loan facility to Europa Oil & Gas (Holdings) PLC. Union Jack <u>published</u> a report by Gaffney Cline on the Reserves and Contingent Resources of the Wressle oilfield.

Morningstar <u>reported</u> that Reabold Resources PLC has sold its investee Corallian Energy Ltd to an unnamed oil and gas major.

Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> that Rathlin Energy (UK) Ltd will no longer be targeting oil at its two sites at West Newton. Rathlin Energy <u>published</u> an update on engineering and the work programme for West Newton. This was also published by <u>Reabold Resources</u> and <u>Union Jack Oil</u>. Shares magazine <u>published</u> a Competent Persons Report by RPS Energy on contingent resources at West Newton.

Blackland Park Exploration have <u>submitted</u> a planning application to Lincolnshire County Council for a proposed well, Whisby-7 at the Whisby A site.

Angus Energy PLC <u>released</u> an update on Saltfleetby saying the side track is due to spud around 20 October.

South East

Surrey County Council planners have <u>recommended</u> refusing planning permission for IGas Energy PLC to install and use two steam methane reformation units to produce grey hydrogen at its site at Bletchingley.

UK Oil & Gas PLC announced that they had raised £3,000,000 through a share placing.

The Dorset Echo <u>reported</u> that Perenco UK Ltd has installed a flare at its Kimmeridge site to burn waste gas while a gas compressor system is installed.

Energy Voice <u>reported</u> that according to an Aberdeen University lecturer, the UK legal system makes it "nearly impossible" to challenge new oil and gas developments on climate grounds.
