East Midlands

Europa Oil & Gas plc <u>published</u> an update presentation for investors. Europa <u>announced</u> a "drop-in session" to discuss their plans to drill at Burniston in Yorkshire. Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on the information meeting at Burniston.

Europa Oil & Gas (Holdings) plc <u>announced</u> that planning permission had been granted for further development of the Wressle well site.

Drill or Drop? <u>reported</u> on Rathlin Energy (UK) Ltd.'s annual accounts for the year ended December 2023. Rathlin Energy <u>announced</u> that they had submitted an application to the Environmental Agency to conduct a reservoir stimulation on their West Newton A-2 well.
